WRITING STYLE All sentences are grammatically correct. All sentences make sense. There is variety in sentence length to give rhythm to the essay. (check that there is no overuse of sentences that begin with "this" and that "this" has a referent). There are no run-ons, fragments or comma splices in the work. There is an unmistakable antecedent for each pronoun. Each sentence begins with a capital letter and ends with a suitable mark of punctuation. All words are correctly spelled. Thought has been given to diction with the inclusion of sophisticated vocabulary and interesting, well-placed words. All punctuation marks make sense and are grammatically coherent. The essay is written in active voice and in the present tense whenever
